ORDINANCE NO. 4605-16

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXCHANGE WITH RENASANT BANK, OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE NINTH (9TH) CIVIL DISTRICT OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, TENNESSEE UPON THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREIN AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS

OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the City of Johnson City (hereinafter the “City”) owns certain real property as shown on EXHIBIT B (consisting of two pages), and

WHEREAS, Renasant Bank (hereinafter “Renasant Bank”) owns certain real property as shown on EXHIBIT A (consisting of two pages), and

WHEREAS, the City and Renasant Bank desire to exchange real property for their mutual benefit,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF JOHNSON CITY as follows:

SECTION I. That the above recitals are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION II. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that conveyance to Renasant Bank by quitclaim deed is hereby authorized for the property as shown on Exhibit B, with the City reserving to itself the drainage easement shown therein, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth verbatim, upon Renasant Bank’s conveyance by special warranty deed to the City the property as shown on Exhibit A which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth verbatim.

SECTION III. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Mayor of the City of Johnson City be and is hereby authorized to execute a quitclaim deed conveying the property shown on Exhibit B and such other instruments as may be reasonably necessary to quitclaim the property as described on Exhibit B, which instruments shall in form and content be satisfactory to the City Manager and legal counsel for the City.

SECTION IV. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION V. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage on third and final reading as required by law, the public welfare requiring it.




